It is the policy of the Tri-County Regional School Board to adopt measures to reduce exposure to communicable diseases in our schools.

PROCEDURE under Policy No **744**

1. Any contagious disease, which can pose a serious health problem, shall be dealt with promptly by the school principal or designate who will advise the Superintendent of Schools or designate and the Board's Occupational Health and Safety Officer.
2. There is no obligation for schools to report any particular illness or disease to the Public Health Department, as that is the responsibility of Doctors and Laboratories. It is necessary, however, to report absentee rates of greater than 10% to the Public Health Department.
