Hello, everyone.

As you can see within our January newsletter, we had a busy, productive month in TCRCE. Welcome back to all students, staff and families. I hope everyone had a smooth transition back to school earlier this month following the holiday break. I want to thank the many school community members who supported a number of special events for students in late December. We ended 2019 in a very positive

way, and are looking forward to a great 2020. It's hard to believe we are already a month in!

Over the holidays, our Property Services staff equipped our TCRCE schools with water dispensers. This followed an announcement we shared with you on December 19, 2019. In accordance with new Health Canada guidelines for acceptable levels of lead in drinking water, all schools will be tested for lead. However, testing may only occur during warmer weather. TCRCE will resume testing in May, when the weather allows us to do so. Until then, we will continue to provide bottled water at our schools. To help reduce waste, we encourage students to bring a reusable water bottle or cup to school. We are almost a month in to this new way of providing water, and it is going well. A special thanks to the Property Services staff who worked hard over the holidays to implement this.

TCRCE continues to focus on student achievement and well-being. As I frequently mention, our System Improvement Plan focuses us on where we currently are, where we need to go, and how we will get there. Earlier this week, we published a document on the tcrce.ca website that provides comprehensive updates on what we have been doing to improve as a system. I encourage you to take a look at it.

Though it seems hard to believe, we are already starting to make initial plans for the 2020-2021 school year. One essential piece of accurately staffing our schools is knowing how many Pre-Primary students are registering at our sites. Over the month of February, we will be publishing reminders to anyone wanting to register a student in Pre-Primary on how to do so. Our online registration for Pre-Primary will be live on the <u>tcrce.ca</u> website in early February.

Minister Zach Churchill met with federal, provincial and territorial counterparts this week in Ottawa to work together on building a strong, more accessible and more affordable early learning and regulated child care system. "Ministers agreed that a variety of perspectives on early learning and child care should be considered—including families, linguistic minority communities, early childhood educators and other experts—as federal, provincial and territorial governments look to implement the next generation of bilateral

agreements while ensuring that important child care services are provided to children and families are not impacted. The priorities and perspectives of First Nations, Inuit and Métis Nation communities on the new federal commitments will also be sought. Ministers agreed to continue working together to disseminate information to Canadians on the positive impacts of their joint investments in early learning and child care.

Students and families all over Nova Scotia celebrated Family Literacy Day on January 27th. Trying to find time to read with your kids to build literacy skills? Car/ bus/train trips, errands, and waits in checkout lines and the doctor's office are all opportunities for reading.
