## Test to Protect Kids Rapid home COVID-19 tests for school-aged children



**NOTE:** A correction was required to the flow chart distributed on October 6, 2021. The direction for children with only one mild symptom who have tested negative on a take-home test has been updated to clarify the child can return to school if they are feeling well; a second take-home test must be taken within 48 hours of the first negative. Please disregard the previous version.

Dear families,

To make testing more accessible, and to support early detection of COVID-19, we are introducing a take-home testing pilot program for families with children under the age of 12. While kit s will be distributed to families over the next few weeks, we wanted to provide this information in advance.

In our public schools, every child in pre-primary to grade six will have the option to receive a take-home testing package. This package contains four (4) take-home COVID-19 tests (with instructions), which can be used at home to test people age 3 and older with mild COVID-19 symptoms.

The COVID-19 PCR tests available at testing sites is the most accurate test for COVID-19. However, the take home tests are a good option if:

- it is difficult for your family to get to a COVID-19 testing site and your child has symptoms of COVID-19
- your child only has one mild symptom and doesn't need a lab-based PCR test (the kind you would receive at a Nova Scotia Health testing site)
- you have reviewed the instructions and feel comfortable doing a shallow nose swab on your child

The flow chart below will help you determine when to use an at-home test and when to stay home. Please read this carefully before using a test and follow the instructions included with the kit. The take-home tests are not the best option if:

- it is easy for your family to go to a Nova Scotia Health testing site
- you don't feel comfortable doing the shallow nose swab on your child
- you think your child is sick and should be seen by a health care provider

The test is **not recommended** if you are a close contact of someone with COVID-19. If you are identified as a close contact, please follow public health direction on testing and isolation.

If the take-home test is negative, it must be repeated after 48 hours. If the take-home test is positive, your child must get a confirmation PCR test. ## **NOTE:**

The test kits have a printed expiry date. The manufacturer has extended the expiry date of these kits for one year. For example, if the test expiry date reads May 2021, the actual expiry date is May 2022.
