Student Transportation

Transportation Policy

Nova Scotia's <u>School Transportation Policy</u> includes eligibility based on distance criteria.

BusPlanner

To access bus stop information, visit the link above, click on Can I Ride A Bus – enter your student's civic address, road/street name, community and grade level – Click Submit. The next page displayed will show, bus route number, pickup and drop-off time, bus stop civic address for both morning and afternoon.

Bus Stops

The Transportation Department is strictly regulated by the Motor Carrier Act and Provincial Transportation Policy. Therefore, busses cannot stop more then three times within 1.6km. Every bus stop must be measured and approved. No bus stop is permanent and may be adjusted as needed.

Moving?

If a family moves or changes daycares, they must contact their child's school with an updated address or alternate address. This change may impact eligibility and/or routing.

Pre-Primary to Grade 2 Students

Parents/guardians (or designate) are responsible for:

Accompanying Pre-Primary to Grade 2 children to the bus stop (and supervising until safely boarded), as well as greeting the child at the stop at the end of the day. If they are not at the stop to meet the child, the parent/guardian (or designate) will be contacted and the child will be returned to the school for pick up.

Buckling and unbuckling the seat belt for their child (if they are less than 40 pounds and 57 inches in height, and only if a seat belt is available). Bus drivers cannot leave their seats. At the school, staff will buckle and unbuckle children.

Late Buses

When there are late buses, a yellow banner will appear on our website with details. Notifications are only posted if the delay is greater than 15 minutes.

Operational Updates

Occupational Health

Safety of our students and employees is a highest priority.

Every school has staff who are trained in first aid and several new first aid kits along with an automated external defibrillator, in the main foyer.

Several practice drills take place throughout the year for fire evacuation, bus evacuation, hold & secure, lockdown and relocation.

Joint Occupational Health & Safety Committee meetings occur regularly.

Technology

This summer, Technology Services completed major improvements to all school networks. In addition to strengthened cyber security, staff and students should see increased speed and performance when accessing online resources.

Ventilation

Ventilation system checks occur regularly and HEPA filtration units are provided to rooms without active ventilation systems.
